General Information

Program

The program for the 41st annual meeting comprises a preconference workshop, three invited addresses and the SPR Presidential Address, fourteen symposia, including a Presidential symposium on emotion, an Early Career Award Address, and three poster sessions, as well as special interest lunches and dinners. Registration

Registration will be held in the Foyer Salle de Bal of Le Centre Sheraton on Wednesday, from 4:00-8:00 PM, and Thursday, Friday and Saturday from 8:30-11:30 AM and 1:00-4:00 PM.

Poster Sessions

Poster sessions will be held in the Salle de Balle Centre from 8:00 to 10:00 PM on Thursday, from 4:30 to 7:00 PM on Friday, and from 7:30 to 9:30 PM on Saturday. Posters should be set up between 10:30 AM and 2:00 PM on the day of the poster session. At least one author should remain with each poster throughout the poster session. Handouts should be available for each poster. Posters may be left up until 10:00 AM on the morning following the poster session.

Transportation

Air:

Most attendees will fly into Montreal-Dorval International Airport. LaQuebecoise provides shuttle bus service from Dorval Airport to the hotel for approximately \$11(Canadian) per person, one-way. No reservations are required. Taxi service to Le Centre Sheraton is available for \$28.

Car:

Driving Directions from Montreal-Dorval International Airport: Follow signs for Autoroute 20 Est (East) from Dorval Airport. From Autoroute 20 Est, link onto Autoroute 720 Est. Take exit Rue Guy, and at the traffic light you will be at the corner of Rue Street Marc and Rene-Levesque Boulevard Ouest (West). Turn right onto Rene-Levesque Boulevard, get into the left lane, and proceed approximately 9 blocks. On Rue Drummond turn left at the traffic light, and you will immediately see the carport entrance for the hotel on your right.

Human Genetics for the Behavioral Sciences: Introduction to Molecular and Quantitative Techniques

This workshop will examine the structure of DNA, the mechanisms involved in protein synthesis, the ways that genes are expressed, and phenotypes with complex genetic bases. The workshop will introduce ways of detecting individual differences at the genetic level (e.g., RFLPs, SSRs, VNTRs, and SNPs), and quantitative methods for linking those differences to phenotypic variation. The workshop will address the establishment of collaborations that will allow psychophysicologists to apply their methods to genetically informative experimental designs.
